Cheshire Chat Distribution Change; "Opt In" Requirement

The Winter 2018 edition (this edition) of the Cheshire Chat will be the last quarterly newsletter mailed to all 508 homes in our neighborhood.

The Board of Directors has decided that going forward, the newsletter will be shared electronically. The exception to this will be any residents that desire to still receive the Cheshire Chat in the mail. Those residents will have to "Opt In" to receive the newsletter via regular USPS mailing. To "Opt In", residents must contact our Association Manager, by phone or preferably by email, no later than 28 February 2018.

By posting the newsletter electronically, there will be a cost savings of approximately \$4500.00 per year that can be programmed for other association requirements.

Future quarterly Cheshire Chats will be posted on the Cheshire Forest website, www.cheshireforest.org, and on the Nextdoor website and app at www.nextdoor.com.

The Board conducted regularly scheduled Board of Director meetings on October 17th, December 19th, and January 16th. Additionally, the Board conducted a special meeting on October 5th to prepare the annual budget and the Annual Meeting on Nov. 21st.

Your Board of Directors continues to focus on maintaining the material condition of neighborhood assets, responsibly managing neighborhood financial resources, and upholding neighborhood standards. The following highlights some of the recently completed and ongoing/future Board of Director actions.

Winter wasted no time bringing us a healthy dose of the white stuff, allowing us to put our snow removal plan to the test! Now that you've seen us in action, let me tell you more about how we handle snow storms in Chesapeake. Every year before winter officially begins, the Public Works Department gets together to inspect their winter weather equipment. Plows are attached to trucks, equipment is tested, salt/sand supply is checked and employees are trained and refreshed on their responsibilities. This annual training session is very important and ensures that our plan still makes sense for our City year after year.

Because we don't get snow storms all that often in Chesapeake, our resources for snow removal are limited. This year we have 38 trucks outfitted with plows and salt spreaders. We stockpile around 2500 tons of salt/sand mixture and have three 10,000 gallon tanks for brine solution. Depending on the severity of the storm, crews may work 12 hour shifts to maximize their efforts. One of the biggest comments we get from residents during snow storms is why we can't plow residential streets. Not only do we not have the resources but neighborhood streets bring with them many challenges like narrow street width, parked cars and limited turning space. We are quite different from those northern cities that get consistent practice with snow removal throughout the year. Our main priority has to be the emergency routes which are the major north/south, east/west thoroughfares and those that provide access to the hospital and fire stations. We always start with those first.

As we see progress there we move on to primary routes, which are those important to business and government work, then secondary and connector routes. Chesapeake has around 2300 lane miles of paved streets so we're not dealing with a small city. Generally, by the time we have the emergency, primary, secondary and connector routes cleared, mother nature helps us out with the rest. You can help us during snow storms by staying off the roads when possible. If you must go out, use extreme caution around plows, give them plenty of space and avoid trying to pass them. Neighborhood Watch Corner: Block Captain Volunteers Needed!

ince it's a New Year, Neighborhood Watch is putting out the call for Block Captain volunteers. We currently have 25 Block Captains located throughout the neighborhood. Ideally, it would be great to have 41 Block Captains to cover the 41 separate streets,

drives, courts, etc. in Cheshire Forest. With 508 homes, obtaining 41 volunteers should be easy.

Being a Block Captain is not time consuming, and to be honest, it's an easy assignment. A Block Captain acts as the eyes and ears for their respective location in the neighborhood. There are no meetings, business is primarily conducted via email. All that we ask is that if you see something suspicious, to report it to the CPD, and inform the Neighborhood Watch co-chairs.

To maintain our Neighborhood Watch status, our group must attend two Chesapeake Crime Prevention Council meetings a year (meetings are quarterly). Currently, the co-chairs attend these quarterly meetings.

The one big event the Neighborhood Watch hosts each year is the National Night Out event which takes place the 1st Tuesday in August. For this event, we ask for volunteers to assist.
